














Foreword by MaxProf's CEO

On 17 August, Amathole District Municipality enjoyed a fun-filled day of different sporting codes. The Mayor's Cup is not only a sporting tournament, but also a social event which addresses the youth regarding social matters such as substance abuse, crime, HIV/AIDS, teenage pregnancy and the likes.

This event is organized by Khula Sport Development & Events which is a non-profit organization established to develop and promote sports in the Eastern Cape rural areas. This has become an annual event used to mark youth-month. The event celebrates emerging stars in soccer, netball and other indigenous sporting codes.

The youth could not be deterred by the rain. The winning teams from the Mayor's Cup proceed to the Provincial Games representing the District. It was amazing to see the commitment the youth had towards their chosen sporting codes, nothing could drag these future leaders down.

MaxProf supported the Amathole District Municipality in this event by sponsorship sporting kits, including soccer balls, and spent the day in the rain with these champions.







MaxProf celebrated the Boianala District Municipality scholars on the 11th of June, by sponsoring uniforms to learners of Rorisang Primary School. This is a school of learners with special needs. During our visit to the school, we could not ignore the fact that the teachers looking after these learners with special needs, were to be commended. Working with these learners is not a task, but rather a calling; when you are called into this position, you must ask the Higher Powers to guide you so that you can treat each special package well and in the way the Creator intended.

The event started with a candle lighting ceremony; it was a special request by the government to all schools that every event should start in this way to show love to the affected, reminding South Africa that HIV is not a death sentence and to remember those that have succumbed to the disease.

Immediately after the candle-lighting ceremony, the SGB Representative, Ms. Boitumelo L. Mosome, welcomed all present, saying that she was happy to see the Executive Mayor, her team and MaxProf. She said, "You are here, we can see the gifts, we are happy. I have no words!"

We then proceeded to the actual purpose of the event where the MMC Finance (Bojanala Platinum DC) explained to the gathering that MaxProf performed a VAT Recovery Review for the municipality and saw a need to plough back to the community of the municipality. This is something MaxProf does for all their clients.

She proceeded in saying that the Bojanala Platinum District Municipality is at this event because Rorisang Primary falls under Moses Kotane Local Municipality which is part of the Bojanala Platinum District. Rorisang Primary School was built in 1994 by Rustenburg Platinum Mine. To date it has 4 standard classrooms, hosts 143 severely disabled individuals from impoverished families travelling to school daily, just like learners attending mainstream schools. This is the only special school in Modikwe, providing inclusive education. The learners that attend this school are cruelly given names like "slow" or "dom", whilst this is so untrue as these children excel at subjects such as welding and woodwork which form part of the school curriculum. They also contribute to South Africa's income generating skills as they do manicures, bricklaying, etc.

These severely intellectually disabled learners are looked after by 12 teachers, including support and cleaning staff.

We were also told that this schools' sport, arts & culture is of top-notch!

MaxProf's Antoinette Ntlele explained to the gathering that MaxProf would love to support all municipalities, however, the mandate specifies that we prioritize MaxProf clients and spend a percentage of turnover within their respective communities. She continued by saying that this time, the mayor asked for specific gifts and promised that as the relationship continued, MaxProf would be back.

NEW SCHOOL SHOES, FULL SOCCER KIT AND A WHEELCHAIR FOR LEPELLE-NKUMPI LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

Lepelle-Nkumpi Local Municipality and Maximum Profit Recovery planned to share love, care and the importance of education at Mathabatha, Zebediela and Matome Villages. The date set aside for this was 13 June and the plans were the following:

- Senior citizens would receive soccer kits and balls;
- The Mashiyane family would receive a wheelchair for their son Luther, and
- The Scheiding, Moshabi, Moleke and Mokgaputji Primary Schools would receive 179 pairs of school shoes & dignitary packs.



The day kicked-off with a briefing with the Mayor at Lepelle-Nkumpi Civic Centre. Immediately after the formal talks, jubilation began and the first activity for the day was in progress. This meant the sponsoring of soccer gear to grandmothers from Zebediela, who engage in football to keep fit, healthy and strong. It is MaxProf's practice to give the youth first preference, however, this was a unique request from the municipality and it was then agreed that new sports kit would be presented to these special ladies. The soccer kit included soccer balls and it was great fun to see these grandmothers playing ball like 16-year-olds.















The Acting Mayor, Councillor Mabote Makgati, said "Thank you for the presents, it is youth month, citizens month is gone, but this is proof that you, our citizens are not forgotten. We will continue working with them!"



From the Civic Centre, the team proceeded to Matome Village to handover a wheelchair. This wheelchair was for Luther Mashiyane, the son of Frans and Susan Mashiyane.

Luther does not attend school due to a disability and his intellectual capability. He has siblings who play with him and he knows who they are, including their names, but he has no friends. Luther was born normal, problems only surfaced at crawling stage. Luther was then taken to hospital where he undergone various tests and had a number of operations, amongst other for a bulging abdomen and a tumor on his head. Luther's family did not disclose his exact condition to MaxProf's Pamela Pege (CSR Project Coordinator). Even though it may seem that the parents have given up in the search of finding the answers to their son's problems, they've learned to accept Luther as he is and the family is now living their lives to the fullest. Luther's father, Frans Mashiyane, said he is thankful to MaxProf and the municipality for understanding that Luther needs mobility. He said this would greatly assist with the challenges faced by the family daily.

In response to the father's talk, The Chief Whip said, "We hope Luther is happy and the wheelchair will come in handy".

In South Africa, June is the month of the youth, in commemoration of South Africa's youth of 1976. MaxProf together with Lepelle Nkumpi Local Municipality remembered the youth by serving, bringing joy, hope and change to those less fortunate.

Over 170 pairs of new school shoes and bags filled with toiletries, including sanitary towels for girls were gifted to learners. This part of the handover was graced by parents, teachers, SAPS officials, school principals and representatives of the South African Democratic Teachers Union (SADTU), as well as Kgoshi Mathabatha to witness 4 primary schools, Scheiding Primary School, Moleke Primary School, Moshabi Primary School and Mogaputji Primary School, receiving gifts.

In expressing gratitude, the SADTU representative, Molokwane Sekitiki, said, "We are glad that the municipality sees the need to come in solidarity with schools to combat the issue of learners walking barefoot to school"; he further commended the municipality for not overlooking the rural communities and expressed that schools in rural areas are often neglected and that the issue may come to an end." Mr. Sekitiki also thanked MaxProf and asked them to continue assisting where they can help, as the municipality cannot provide in all the community's needs.

The acting mayor of Lepelle-Nkumpi Local municipality, Councillor Mabote Makgati, encouraged the community to support the kids who walk long distances to schools. "It is important to the municipality to eradicate the embarrassment faced by children being without proper and sufficient school uniforms. We are grateful to Maximum Profit Recovery for choosing to make an impact in our area and urge the learners to do their best and the communities to strive to always safeguard the future of our children."

NO MORE BAREFOOTED WALKS TO SCHOOL FOR THESE EAGER LEARNERS

Children walking barefoot to school everyday to seek education, to build a better tomorrow, is what prompted MaxProf to engage in communication with the municipality to assist struggling learners. MaxProf opted to donate school shoes and jerseys.

MaxProf and the Letsemeng Local Municipality's team took two days out of the office on 10 and 11 July, visiting over 200 learners of Inoseng Primary School (Petrusburg), A.J.C Jooste Combined School (Petrusburg), Holpan Intermediate School (Jacobsdal), Ikanyegeng Combined School (Jacobsdal), Tswelopele ka Thuto Intermediate School (Luckoff), Oppermans Grond Primary School (Koffiefontein) and Leretlhabetse Primary School (Koffiefontein). For mid-winter, it was heartwarming to see all the smiles on the children's faces when they received their school shoes and jerseys.

Proper school uniforms give these learners confidence to participate in activities as their self-esteem is boosted and they feel like they belong. Having uniforms stops absenteeism and poor academic performance.

The learners that benefited from this donation are from poverty stricken families, identified by the school teachers working with the Ward Councilors and the School Governing Body.

As MaxProf continues assisting schools, we realize that learners are hungry for education, but lack discourages this hunger. Therefore, we as MaxProf continue to support the scholar, the future of our country.

As part of MaxProf's Social Responsibility programme, we, together with the office of the Mayor of the Ngaka Modiri Molema District Municipality, selected a few projects which were intended to uplift the community, support learners at Masephe Primary, Modiba Combined and Banabakae Primary Schools and to provide necessary tools for the development of youth in the area.

The programme was done in two parts; the first being a visit to Masephe Primary and Modiba Combined School on 14 June, with the Executive Mayor of the Ngaka Modiri Molema District Municipality, Cllr. T.J. Makolomakwa and his team.

168 pairs of school shoes, 6 soccer kits, 12 athletic kits and 10 soccer balls were donated to Modiba Combined, Masephe and Banabakae Primary Schools.

Our efforts are often met with great joy, being our greatest reason to continue working to advance disadvantaged communities. A special message of appreciation was given to us by the Principal of Madiba Combined Primary School, saying, "I am very happy with the school shoes given to our learners, as they will assist our learners in coming to school and to listen attentively without fear of cold weather".

The second part of our visit took place on the 17th of July, where MaxProf and the Ngaka Modiri Molema District Municipality's team arrived bright and early for a fun day with learners from Masephe and Banabakae Primary Schools. The children were very excited and could not keep their hands off the soccer balls and their highly appreciated new school shoes.

The team then rushed off to their next location, the sports grounds of Hoërskool Zeerust where two learners of Banabakae came out tops at an athletics tournament held on this day. These youngsters showcased their talent regardless of their backgrounds. We call this passion! The athletics kits requested by the school from the municipality and sponsored by MaxProf, were used during this tournament. The learners were privileged to be the owners of brand new athletics kits and for the first time, they felt like they too could become anything they wanted to be.

As we travel around South Africa, giving out school shoes and uniform to the learners in need, it is heart-breaking that you have a list of "seriously in-need learners" provided to us by schools, only to have teary faces looking at you because their names were not on the list. This happened at one of the schools and MaxProf commitment to delivering more shoes to these learners.

On this leg of the visit (Masephe Primary and Banabakae Primary School's), the MaxProf team was accompanied by the Ngaka Modiri Molema Districts' Speaker, Yoliswa Sechoaro and the Chief Whip, Itumeleng Lethoko.

Banabakae's Principal was so excited that finally someone visited their school; she could not stop encouraging her learners to work hard at everything they do.

The Home for the Needy is based at Lethabong Section in Donkerhoek, Pretoria East.

MaxProf's second team headed to Refilwe Orphan Care Centre in Refilwe, Cullinan. This centre opened its doors in 2007 and is the brainchild of an unemployed lady who could not stand the sight of poverty and vulnerable children, including orphans. The owner tells us that her dream is to continue assisting the orphans and the vulnerable to fit in with other children and with society in general. Currently the Refilwe Orphan Care Centre has 11 volunteers, most of them unemployed, assisting two hundred and fifty (250) children with after-school care; food provision; after-school (homework) assistance; life skills and recreational activities; counselling and support for the orphans, vulnerable children and care givers; conducting home visits to abused children and assisting with computer training.

Mandela Day inspires us to act, to make the world a better place, ultimately empowering communities all over South Africa. A global movement towards positive change begins with small actions!
